Denial of Death

LENT IS HARD. It forces us to confront all kinds of things we would rather not believe exist, like violence, brutality and betrayal. Mostly, it requires us to confront our own mortality and death. We don't like to think about our death. We generally choose to avoid the thought of it at all costs.

The pandemic which has ravaged our world is hard. It has forced us to consider our own mortality and even our death. Even more, it has slowed down our activity, so we have not been able to busy ourselves and avoid such reflection.

Ernest Becker, in his 1973 Pulitzer Prize winning book, **THE DENIAL OF DEATH**, raised up, for the first time, that the fear of death is humankind's primary motivator. A classic psychologist, Becker clearly argues against most of those who preceded him. Also, and unlike his peers, Becker was deeply committed to his faith.

The beauty of Becker's work is that it helps us to see the root of our fears and the extraordinary work we do to deny the reality of our mortality and death. In fact, Becker argues, we spend most of our time creating narratives that help us to do just that.

The irony of our Christian faith is that we have a savior, Jesus, who did not deny His death. We clearly see that Jesus embraced His death, while also connecting to our humanity in fearing it. Looking at the Passion narrative, we see how all the main players in the story were about the work of trying to deny their death and save themselves - especially in the face of Jesus' willingness to die for us.

Jesus teaches us the same thing that Becker does. Ultimately, when we learn to embrace our death is when we truly find life. Jesus proves, by His dying and rising, that our death does not have the final word.

In the midst of all that is hard, we have hope.



Grow Spiritually: Spiritual Renewal During Lent



Lent is the 40-day period between Ash Wednesday and Easter when we prepare ourselves spiritually for new life in Christ. The ashes of Ash Wednesday remind us of our mortality and sinfulness. The season of Lent is a good time for reflecting on our relationship with God and others and committing to positive changes in our lives so that we can grow as followers of Christ. Many Christians abstain from certain activities or foods during this time as a means of controlling our temptations. These activities are especially helpful when they draw us closer in our relationship with God.

This Lent, you may also want to add an activity or spiritual practice, a Bible reading plan, visiting the Lenten prayer stations in our Chapel, or focusing on being more loving and caring toward family, friends, coworkers and community.

Deb Coyle's Bible Journey

In December of 2019, Deb Coyle first heard about a year-long Bible-reading project from Julie Hestermann, Sheridan's Director of Faith Formation. When Julie sent her the link to the resource, Deb eagerly followed it and began her reading journey on January 1, 2020.

This resource is thebible Recap.com. THE BIBLE RECAP splits up the entire Bible into daily readings that only take 10-15 minutes to read. There is

a corresponding podcast available for each reading that clarifies ideas and connects to previous days. Additional resources are also available, such as videos, maps and previews of upcoming readings. Every episode features a daily "God Shot," something you can take away from the reading about the nature of God.

The readings are chronological, so the Bible seems like "one big story," Deb says. Even the more "dry" parts of the Bible, like Old Testament genealogies, are made interesting because you get to know characters and follow the lineage of Christ. Deb notes that it was interesting to see the full context surrounding well known Bible stories.

For Deb, this experience reinforced the desire to build a deeper relationship with God and get to know Him better. Her biggest takeaway from her journey was that God has such a multi-faceted personality. Through reading the entire Bible, the personalities of Jesus, God and the Holy Spirit became much closer and more real. "I look forward to it every day," she says.
